## **Scott Walker's policies are bad for Wauwatosa**

The agenda of Governor Scott Walker and the Republican Party is hurting the schools and municipal services of Wauwatosa that residents here have spent generations building up, and that current residents depend on daily. For example, teachers are giving up \$5 million in wages and benefits this year and next year's school budget will be cut by \$7 million that threatens major layoffs of teachers across the district as well as undermining the quality of education in the district. The city of Wauwatosa is currently losing \$917,000 in state aids, and even after a \$643,000 contribution from workers' compensation, faces cuts of \$243,000 to recycling and other services. In addition, the budget takes away local control over important financial decisions in our community.

# Grassroots Tosa Calls for Recall of Scott Walker

Grassroots Tosa along with thousands of Wisconsinites are moving ahead with efforts to recall Governor Scott Walker and Lieutenant Governor Rebecca Kleefisch. When elected Governor in November 2010, Scott Walker had the choice to represent all the people of the state of Wisconsin, but he chose to govern from a very partisan agenda, taking away hard fought rights and programs that have made Wisconsin a leading state for innovation and shared prosperity. He ran a dishonest campaign for election in 2010, never indicating he would move to take away the collective bargaining rights of 175,000 public employees, initiate massive cuts to public education, health and family services and dismantle regulations that protect our natural resources. That betrayal can only be addressed with his removal from office.

There are other policies of his agenda that warrant this recall effort:
